## STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

*The purpose of the Livingston College Core is to engage students in a broad spectrum of intellectual experiences reflective of the college's commitment to preparing students to understand the local, national, and global components of our historical and modern social order, as well as to think critically and act responsibly in the contemporary world. The core embodies Livingston College's current focus on "Building Community," as well as its historical commitment to "Strength Through Diversity." We encourage you the student to use the Livingston Core to not only build a strong academic foundation as a college student, but also to explore a varied and diverse set of intellectual, political and cultural perspectives.*

## OVERVIEW of CORE REQUIREMENTS

1. 10 courses are required (9 for Transfer students) distributed according to the guidelines specified below for each core area
2. A grade of C or better is required in each course
3. No more than **three** Core courses from any one academic department
4. Any one course can only fulfill one Core requirement
5. All courses must be **three** or more credits

## ALL STUDENTS

1. Arts & Humanities - 2 courses required from different departments; only 1 can be a foreign language.
2. Social Science - 1 course required
3. Natural Science - 1 course required
4. Quantitative & Analytical - 1 course required
5. Diversity - 2 courses required from different departments (foreign languages excluded)
6. Contemporary National Issues - 1 course required
7. International Issues - 1 course required
