

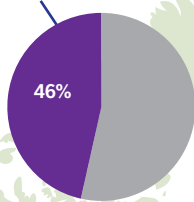

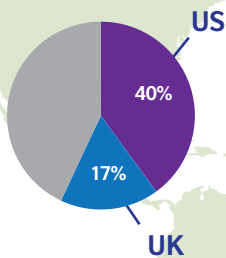
ALMOST HALF OF LEADERS HAVE INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

International education and/or work experience



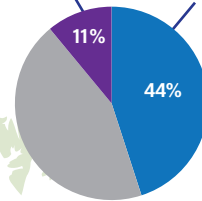
→ Study overseas increases with degree level

55% OF PROFESSIONAL LEADERS HOLD A SOCIAL SCIENCES OR HUMANITIES DEGREE

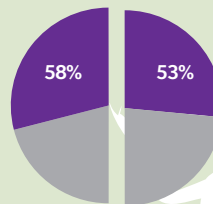
Humanities 11% Social Sciences 44%



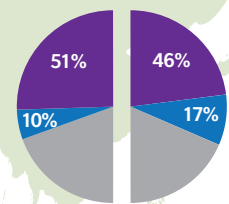
→ Those in government are more likely to have social science degrees while those in non-profits favour humanities degrees
